

At the beginning of October, central and southern Bosnia and Herzegovina were hit with severe flooding. Towns, villages, roads, bridges and railways were overcome by floodwaters and landslides. The flooding claimed the lives of twenty-seven victims. The worst hit locations were Konjic, Jablanica, Kiseljak and Fojnica. The international community rallied to offer aid and assistance to the people of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

EUFOR joined the international community to offer support, assistance and help where possible. Through supplies, logistics and manpower, EUFOR joined the efforts to overcome the effects of the tragic flooding.


After receiving a request from the Ministry of Security of BiH, EUFOR dispatched its helicopter asset for the medical evacuation of an injured child, from a flood-affected area in Donja Jablanica.

The medical helicopter H145 extracted the injured patient from the landing zone at the railway station plateau and successfully evacuated to Mostar cantonal hospital "Safet Mujić".

Through close cooperation and the use of a liaison officer in situ, **EUFOR** established communications with the BiH Operation and Communication Centre, which was coordinating effort to combat the floods at the time.

EUFOR's Liaison Observation Teams (LOTs) joined with Troop Contributing **Nations** (TCNs) medical provide valuable assistance and donations including food, water and relief materials. EUFOR members from the Turkish

the effects of the flooding. TCNs such as Hungary, who deployed a military engineer's team, were joined by EUFOR troops to support and assist local authorities and the people of BiH.

President of the EU Commission, Ursula von der Leyen noted during her inspection of the Jablanica area, that the support provided by EUFOR in conjunction with the local authorities and AF BiH was of the utmost importance and thanked all involved.

EUFOR wishes to express its deepest condolences to all those affected by the floods. Our taughts and prayers are with those who lost loved ones during this terrible time.

formation of EUFOR marked a new chapter in Bosnia and Herzegovina's post-conflict symbolizina recovery, EU's enduring commitment to peace, stability, and the region's integration into European structures. EUFOR's mission began in 2004 when it assumed the responsibilities of preceding multinational forces in Bosnia and Herzegovina. In the past 20 years EUFOR has evolved continuously as the situation in the area of operations developed.

By 2004 the terrible conflict was over and the volatile postconflict phase had also passed. Therefore EUFOR took up a role that suited the circumstances on the ground. The early tasks involved reducing the level of organized crime and

decommissioning the large amount of military weapons still circulating in society.

The European Union aimed to ensure the security of the country and the broader goals of reconciliation, the rule of law, and democratic development. As the country became more secure, EUFOR shifted focus to supporting the national institutions such as the Armed Forces of Bosnia and Herzegovina and law enforcement agencies in their respective roles.



The stability provided by EUFOR has facilitated the country in moving forward the implementation reforms aimed strengthening democratic governance, improving the rule of law, and preparing for its future integration into the European Union.

EUFOR successes came as a result of the commitment, energy and sacrifice of those who served and continue to serve peace and stability in Bosnia and Herzegovina. This includes not only our international military forces, but also our international and local civilian personnel.

For those who have lost their lives in service; we are eternally grateful for the life force they expended creating

EUFOR Blood Donation

EUFOR Medical section organized the "EUFOR Blood Donation" event in Camp Butmir in November. Lieutenant Colonel Dr. Milan Simeonov Tsekov PhD of the Bulgarian contingent, Medical Advisor of EUFOR organized the blood donation. The event was coordinated with the local health organization Institute for Transfusion Medicine of the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina and graciously supported by the institute's director Mrs Dr. Aida Đozo.

Blood donation is a necessity and in its essence is a humane manifestation, as it helps people in need and saves lives. Just one blood donation can save up to three lives. More than 38,000 blood donations are needed every day. Every two seconds, a patient needs blood. More than 1 million people are diagnosed with cancer every year for the first time. Many will need blood transfusions, especially during chemotherapy. Blood has no analogue, no substitute. The positives of voluntary blood donation are great because it is recognized worldwide as the safest way to donate blood.

Over 90 soldiers and civilians took part in the event. This selfless and important act will no doubt have a positive impact on the lives of those in need of transfusion. EUFOR thanks all who are involved especially the organizers, those who gave blood and the Institute for Transfusion Medicine of the Federation of Bosnia and Herzegovina.

On the night of 2 December 2024, EUFOR marked its 20-year anniversary with the EUFOR Gala. The event held in the Army Hall in Sarajevo, brought together national and international colleagues with EUFOR to mark this significant anniversary.

The gala opened with the EUFOR 20 year anniversary video and followed by Commander EUFOR Major General László Sticz speech to the guests. Major General Sticz outlined the history of EUFOR and the differing types of activities the mission has engaged in over the past two decades. He noted the success of the mission was built on the cornerstones of cooperation and support from both national and international partners. He highlighted that the gala and anniversary were not just an opportunity to reflect on the past but also to look to the future, "tonight is not just about reflecting on the past; it is also about looking to the future. 

The event also included a musical performance from Horváthné Nemcsok Ágnes and Muhamed Trnka. They performed to an excellent level and kept the audience captivated throughout. The event saw a visit from the famed "Krampus". Traditionally the 6 December marks the feast day of Saint Nicholas, a 4th-Century Greek bishop who became the patron saint of children and is the reallife origin of the Father Christmas legend. In the Central European Saint Nicholas Day is marked, like the Italian Epiphany, by the giving of gifts to well-behaved



kids. The night before however, is when the Krampus visits. The Krampus, a demonic figure - halfman and half-goat, depicted with a huge waggling tongue, dark fur, horns and wild eyes - punishes naughty children. Naturally, our Krampus visit was a more fun and lighthearted event, played excellently by members of the Austrian contingent. It certainly was an eye opening attraction for those of EUFOR not familiar with the famed demon.

The stands themselves offered a wide variety of foods and drinks. From the Greek Souvlaki to the Austrian mulled wine, the large

crowds of civilians and soldiers fully embraced the spirit of the event and indulged in all the different cultures. Such was the demand and interest from attendees that the Irish Coffees were almost gone before the event officially launched and the Italian ovens were still churning out pizza's long after the event had closed.

The Winter Festival was also time for reflection and acknowledgement of the hard work done by the civilian staff during the year. COM EUFOR Major General László Sticz gave out a number of awards and letters of appreciation to civilian employees of EUFOR. COM EUFOR thanked all who attended the event, all of those whose hard work made it possible and all the civilian workers for their dedication throughout the year.

The tour also included the opportunity for COM EUFOR to meet with a number of local authorities and agencies throughout the country.









Celebrating National Weeks

The continuing tradition of celebrating national weeks saw a further nine nations' culture highlighted over the past three months. During this time the Spanish, Greek, Austrian, Turkish, Polish, Czech, Slovak, Romanian and German weeks all took place giving Camp Butmir and its troops a chance to learn about their national cultures, experiences, history and traditions.

In October, the Spanish contingent celebrated the Spanish national week. EUFOR members had the opportunity to learn about Spanish culture, history and traditions. During the week, they also celebrated National Day of Spain, which commemorates the discovery of the Americas by Christopher Columbus for Spain on 12 October 1492. The date is a key point for Spain's overseas influence and legacy to the world and to the Americas in particular. The Ambassador of Spain to Bosnia and Herzegovina, H.E. Maria Molina Alvarez de Toledo laid a wreath in memory of their comrades in Camp Butmir.

Our Greek comrades introduced EUFOR troops to a unique insight to the different styles of Greek dress, past times and cuisine during their national week. A highlight included the traditional clothing from different areas of Greece. There was a man from the North East part, called THRAKI, a lady from the Greek Islands of the Aegean Sea and a couple, a man and a lady from PONTOS, whose people now live mainly in north part of Greece mainly. The week was opened and closed with a flag raising ceremony with Deputy Head of Mission Greek Embassy in Sarajevo Georgios Kollias, in attendance. The week was a great success and a fantastic view of Greek culture and history.

The Austrian national week was filled with a variety of Austrian traditions and past times such as log sawing, table football, barrel tapping, music and traditional dress. The week also included flag raising ceremonies and a celebration of Austrian national day on 26 October. The 26 October celebrates the day the Austrian parliament declared the nation's neutrality and independence from foreign powers. Parades, festivals, and fireworks mark the holiday across the country. The closing event was a significant highlight of the week and perfectly displayed





the spirit and humor of the Austrian contingent.

The next national week saw the Turkish contingent introduce our troops to its rich history, traditions and culture. As part of the Turkish National Week, the 101st anniversary of the Republic of Türkiye was also celebrated. EUFOR troops had the chance to taste foods such as döner, çiğ köfte and baklava, and watch traditional folk dances. EUFOR troops received a brief on the "Vuran" armored vehicle, accompanied by Turkish tea and Turkish delight. There was also a unique patch developed and distributed for the event. The Republic Day of Türkiye included a ceremony to mark the importance of commemorating the proclamation of the Republic of Türkiye. The event included an array of traditional dancing, video exploring the exquisite landscape of Türkiye and the activities of the Turkish Armed Forces. The event was attended by H.E. Sadık Babür Girgin, Ambassador of Türkiye to Bosnia and Herzegovina.

The Polish national week took place in November. The week also celebrated Polish Independence Day on 11 November. The national day commemorates the anniversary of the restoration of Poland's sovereignty in 1918. Flag raising ceremonies accompanied by the awarding of commemorative medals from the 27th



Polish contingent of EUFOR to the COM EUFOR, DCOM EUFOR and COS EUFOR. The week gave EUFOR troops a welcomed chance to learn about the history of Poland and experience different Polish traditions and culture. Commander of EUFOR Major General László Sticz praised the contingent's loyalty and devotion to duty, qualities reflective of the Polish nation and its peoples.

The Czech and Slovak contingents provided a unique combined national weeks. The week also included both nations' national holidays on 17 November, a day when in 1939 students demonstrated against the Nazi regime in Prague and in 1989, student protests sparked the Velvet Revolution and ultimately helped lead to the downfall of the communist regime. During the week, there was the opportunity for EUFOR members to view cinematic classics from each nation, to partake in each nation's different foods and drinks and flag raising ceremonies.

Our Romanian colleagues held their national week at the beginning of December. The week included the Romanian National Day, "Great Union Day"; this annual public holiday is celebrated every year to mark the unification of Transylvania, Bassarabia, and Bukovina, with the Romanian Kingdom in 1918. Each year, on first of December, the Romanian flag is flown over Romanian homes and institutions. During the national week, there was a host of activities such as a movie night and sporting competitions while the DFAC served a variety of traditional Romanian cuisine. The week was opened and closed with a flag raising ceremony, as is the custom in EUFOR. During his opening speech, Deputy COM EUFOR praised Romania for its longstanding commitment to peacekeeping in Bosnia and Herzegovina started with the deployment of an engineering battalion in March 1996.

The final nation week of 2024 was that of the German contingent. The week was packed with a host of experiences for the soldiers of EUFOR to embrace. With freshly brewed coffee at the tea and coffee stand with delicious winter cake, the flavors of traditional savory German cuisine, a day at the shooting range, the harmony of German music and a basketball tournament, EUFOR was truly treated to an eventful few days. The week was a great opportunity to experience the rich culture and heritage of the German peoples. The video produced for the week allowed for a more in depth view of German geography, cities and culture. It also included the 2014 World Cup victory in Rio de Janeiro.











Medal Parades in Camp Butmir







Since our last edition of EUFOR Forum, three medals parades have taken place. The first was in October, the second in November and third in December.

In cognition of their unwavering service to EUFOR and Bosnia and Herzegovina, soldiers and civilians are presented with the European Union's Common Security and Defence Policy Medal for Operation Althea.

The Medal is awarded by the High Representative of the European Union for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy, Mr. Josep Borrel Fontelles to EUFOR personnel in recognition of having fully met the requirements of eligibility and having completed the necessary period of service as a member of the EU mission. The Medal was first awarded in 2004 and is given to every international member who serves in EUFOR. It is tradition for the medal to be worn for the whole day after it is awarded.

During the medal parade in October, 421 soldiers, airmen, sailors and marines from 16 nations received their Common Security and Defence Policy Medal for Operation ALTHEA. During his speech, Commander of EUFOR Major General László Sticz highlighted that the medal parade "stands as a symbol of what can be



accomplished when nations come together for a shared goal. For those of you who have completed your tour of duty, today is especially significant. Each of you played a vital role in maintaining a secure and stable environment in Bosnia and Herzegovina."

A highlight of the ceremony was the awarding of the Hungarian military medal of merit to DCOM and COS. The medal was awarded by COM EUFOR In recognition of the contribution, dedication and loyalty to the successful implementation of the Hungarian Command Year of EUFOR by both leaders. Major General Sticz emphasized that both brigadier generals are strong pillars of the European Union's peacekeeping mission in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

The "Honours for the Partnership" has been established in 2018 and is awarded by the Chief of Defence of the Hungarian Defence Forces to foreign soldiers in recognition of their outstanding performance while carrying out joint tasks with Hungarian troops.

In November, EUFOR held the second parade. Soldiers and civilians from Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Germany, Greece, Italy, Portugal, Romania and Türkiye were presented medals by COM EUFOR, Major General László Sticz, DCOM EUFOR Brigadier General Lorenzo Dal Maso and DCOS Sp Colonel Anastas Bakalov.

In December, over 130 soldiers were awarded for their medal. Soldiers including our two canine members of the mission and civilians from Austria, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Italy, Poland and the Netherlands received the European Union's Common Security and Defence Policy Medal.
